## AMGURI COLLEGE: A GLANCE

Established on 17th July, 1967, Amguri College remains the premier institute of higher education, imparting knowledge to the entire locality of Amguri and its nearby area. The college is brought under the deficit system of Grant-in-Aid in 1977 and is affiliated to the Dibrugarh University, Dibrugarh. The college is recognised by University Grants Commission (UGC) in 1998 and has been included in the list of institutions under 2(f) and 12(B) of UGC Act, 1950. The college offers undergraduate degrees in Arts and Commerce under the affiliating university. Besides, it runs Higher Secondary Courses and offers plethora of programmes in distance mode under Dibrugarh University Distance Education Council and Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University (KKHSOU).

The College, enriched with all round co-education activities, has its widespread fame in the entire region and has now turned into a hub of more than 1500 students from all sections of the society.

The College has completed its 50 year journey. Recently NAAC visited Amguri College and awarded Grade with B<sup>+</sup> (CGPA 2.55).

## LOCATION OF THE COLLEGE

The college inherits a scenic beauty. It is situated in an area of evergreen hills neighboring to Nagaland and surrounded by reputed tea gardens and tea industries along sides. The college is located at a distance of about one and half Kilometers from Amguri Town. Various transport services are there from the town to the college. While travelling from Sivasagar or Jorhat, one has to stop at Jhanji and then move through NH-61 a distance of about 5KMs to reach Amguri Town.

  - Higher Secondary Course (Arts) Two Years :  
Subjects: Assamese, Advance Assamese, English, Alternative English, Economics, Mathematics\*, Education, History, Political Science, Sociology, Logic & Philosophy,
  - Higher Secondary Course (Commerce) Two Years :  
Subjects: General English, MIL (Assamese)/Alternative English, Book Keeping & Accountancy, Business Studies, Salesmanship & Advertising and Economics.
  - Post-Graduate Diploma in Computer Application (PGDCA) (12 months)

\* Dibrugarh University will implement CBCS from next academic year (2018-19). As per the new guidelines of D.U., those students who intends to take Economics as a Major subject in Degree, must have to study Mathematics as a subject in H.S. level.

## SUBJECT COMBINATIONS/COURSE STRUCTURE

### BACHELOR PROGRAMME (ARTS)

#### Major Course

- General English as compulsory for all students in the 1st and 2nd Semesters.
- MIL (Assamese) or Alternative English is compulsory for all in the 1st and 2nd Semesters.
- Students can offer major course in any of the following :
  - Assamese
  - English
  - Economics
  - Education
  - History,
  - Political Science
  - Sociology
- Environmental Study and Computer Skill/Communication Skill are compulsory for all 3rd semester students. The marks secured in Environmental Study are evaluated in Grades.
- One Multidisciplinary course is compulsory for all 4th semester students.

#### General Course

- For General course, the points (a), (b), (d) and (e) under Major course apply
- Apart from that, a student of General Course has to opt any two subjects from the **Followings** : Economics, Education, History, Political Science, Sociology & Philosophy.



## BACHELOR PROGRAMME (COMMERCE)

**Major Courses** : Accounting & Finance, Marketing, Banking & Insurance, Human Resource Management.

**B.Com (General) Course** : As per university syllabus.

## HIGHER SECONDARY (ARTS)

- English is compulsory for all as a subject.
- MIL(Assamese) or Alternative English as a Compulsory subject.
- Any three from Group A  
Economics, Education, Political Science, Sociology.
- Any one from Group B  
Mathematics, History, Adv. Assamese, logic & Philosophy.

## HIGHER SECONDARY (COMMERCE)

- English is compulsory for all as a subject.
- MIL(Assamese) or Alternative English as Compulsory subject
- Book Keeping & Accountancy and Business Studies are compulsory for all students Besides, students must offer Economics, and Salesmanship & Advertising as subjects. But, of these two, subject with higher marks will be counted in the final examination.

## DISTANCE EDUCATION PROGRAMME

Apart from the regular courses, the college has affiliated study centres for distance mode education programme under Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University (KKHSOU) and Dibrugarh University Distance Education Council. The various programmes offered in these study centres are BPP, BA, B.Com, BMC, BBA, D.El.Ed, MA (Assamese, Political Science, Economics, Sociology, English, Mass Communication), MSW. Beside, the B. B.Ed course is likely to be started from this academic session. These programmes are intended to meet the needs of ambitious employed persons who are desirous to pursue higher education. These courses are offered at nominal cost. The present number of enrolment in the distance courses has already crossed 500.

## SELF FINANCED COURSE

Keeping in mind the need for computer literacy at the present scenario, the college has introduced PGDCA course.

## REMEDIAL AND TUTORIAL CLASSES

We have provision for Remedial Classes in English for poor and SC/ST students. Besides, tutorial classes in all subjects are arranged both for H.S. and Degree Level students.



## ADMISSION TO VARIOUS COURSES

- A. Degree Courses (BA/B.Com): Admission to these courses begins as per the instruction of the Dibrugarh University.
- B. H.S. First Year : Admission process begins after the declaration of H.S.L.C. Examination result.
- C. H.S. Second Year : Admission process begins after the declaration of the H.S. First Year examination result. The classes will begin as per the instruction of the Assam Higher Secondary Council (AHSEC).
- D. Admission to these courses is purely on merit basis and is subject to the approval of the Principal/Academic Advisory Committee.

## RESERVATION OF SEATS

Reservation of seats for SC/ST/OBC/PH students is done as per the prevailing government rules. There is also reservation for students having outstanding performance in sports and culture.

## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- i) For admission to a course, the student must apply in the prescribed form enclosed in this prospectus.
- ii) Candidates seeking admission under reserved category must submit attested copies of required certificates from appropriate authority.
- iii) Attested copies of the mark sheet of last qualifying examination along with a copy of the provisional pass certificate from the head of the institution last attended must be submitted.
- iv) Two copies of the present passport size photograph (one copy to be passed in the application form)
- v) Gap Certificate from competent authority is necessary for those students who have passed the qualifying examination earlier than the current academic year.
- vi) The following documents in 'ORIGINAL' must be produced at the time of admission
  - a) Mark-Sheet of the last examination passed
  - b) Provisional pass certificate from the Head of the institution last attended
  - c) Gap Certificate (if required)
  - d) Reserved category certificate (if required)

The completed application form along with necessary documents must be submitted to the college within the specified dates as notified in the college notice board in due course of time. The incomplete application form and the form submitted after the last dates will not be entertained.

The candidates will be called for interview and the selected candidates will be given spot admission to the applied courses after payment of required fee. The admitted students are shall have to pay fee as per below :

### FREE ADMISSION RULES & REGULATION

1. Students whose parental annual income is less than Rs. 1 Lakh from all sources will be eligible to avail this scheme.
2. An Income Certificate from the Local Revenue Circle Officer/Mauzadar.
3. A declaration from the students that neither of the parent (father or mother) of the student is an employee of State/Central Govt. Department or its undertaking. Such form shall be devised by the concerned Registrars/Principals. If such a declaration is found to be false, the admission shall be cancelled and fee shall be realized from such students.

#### Duties and Responsibilities of Students availing the Scheme :

Students seeking admission into 1st year will plant a sapling at his/her College or at his/her home and shall give photograph of the same to the college. The student has to nurse the sapling and while seeking admission into second year shall give photograph of the same tree that was planted during previous year.

**NOTE** - As per the govt. notification No. PC/HE/SOPD/02/2017/20, Dated Kahilipara, the 23rd May, 2017 and No. PC/HE/Plan-24/2012/112, Dated Kahilipara, the 20th May/2017, the fee for admission into TDC/H.S. may be modified.

For administration, there is an administrative building with offices for Principal and working administrative staff separately. Office is fully computerized and modern electronics equipment (swipe machine), for cashless transaction is available.

## INFRASTRUCTURAL AND CO-CURRICULAR FACILITIES FOR STUDENTS

### HOSTEL FOR GIRLS STUDENTS

The College has an RCC hostel for girls far-off places. The two-storied hostel has a capacity for 100 boarders. Hostel accommodation with all the required amenities such as running water, uninterrupted power supply, sanitation etc. is provided at a very nominal fee.



### COLLEGE LIBRARY

Amguri college library is fully computerised and is enriched with more than 20000 text books. Besides, the library has subscribed number of periodicals including magazines, journals and newspapers of regional, national and international repute. The library is equipped with well furnished reading rooms for students and teachers along with other facilities such as reprography, book bank, information circulation board etc. The library has an integrated digital-cum-online interface. The students can borrow books from the library for specified period of time. For the purpose, they are issued with College Library cards. Moreover, book bank facility is available for poor and meritorious students.



## DIGITAL CLASSROOM

Digital Classrooms with modern technology and smart education are available for the students where they can gather maximum knowledge within a very short span of time. The digital classrooms make the entire education environment more interactive, interesting and beneficial.



## LANGUAGE LABORATORY

Language laboratory equipped with modern technology and teaching aids is opened up in the college with an endeavour to facilitate the students to learn English in a perfect way through proper pronunciation and spellings.



## SPORTS

Special attention is given to the sports environment of the college. The college has number of sports infrastructures including Basket Ball Court, Outdoor Stadium, Multi-Gymnasium Hall, Indoor Stadium. College Weeks are organised annually in the college premises. Amguri college encourage students to participate in sports activities cross the states.



## STUDENT COMMON ROOM

Common rooms with required amenities like water supply, electricity and sanitation are available separately for both boys and girls.

## AUDITORIUM

An Auditorium with a well-decorated and well-equipped stage and a sitting capacity of more than one thousand participants is available in the college.



## CONFERENCE HALL

The college has an air conditioned, well-equipped and well furnished conference hall with video-conferencing system and a sitting capacity for 70 participants.



## HALLS AND ROOMS

Several spacious Halls and Rooms are available for course classes. These halls and rooms have uninterrupted power supply. The building known as 'Guru-Bhawan' built with MPLAD fund is specially used for Major (Honours) subject classes.

## DRINKING WATER

24 Hours drinking water with cooling facility is available for both the teachers and students.

## SANITATION

Sanitation facility with adequate numbers of urinals and latrines are provided separately for teachers and students. Besides, there is separated provision for boys and girls.

## STUDENTS' UNION OFFICE

Office for students' Union with computer facility is provided in the college for smooth running of various union activities.

## COLLEGE CANTEEN

College canteen is there for both the teachers and students.

## SAFETY MEASURES

For students' safety, person nels have been appointed in the college gate where entry and exit of outsiders are observed and recorded. Moreover, the college has boundary walls and the entire premises are under CCTV surveillance. Fire extinguishers are installed in different corners of the institution.

## HEALTH CARE

Health camps are organized in the college occasionally for various health check-up. These services are provided free to the teachers and students.



## INFORMATION SOURCES

Students have access to various information sources like College Notice Boards, Library Notice Boards and Departmental Notice Boards. Information is notified in due course of time by the concerned notification authority. Moreover, students have access to facilities like internet with Wi-Fi connectivity for the entire college campus.

## SPECIAL CLASS FOR H.S. COURSE STUDENT

Special classes are arranged for students of H.S. Course during vacation period.

## BARRIER FREE EDUCATION

The college has the provision for Barrier Free Education as per UGC direction.

## EXTENSION ACTIVITIES

Amguri College performed various extension activities as a part of activities of NSS, NCC, Women study centre, Eco club & Women cell. The Women Cell, Amguri college has adopted a Missing village and do various activities for socio-economics development of the said village.

The pilot project "Maitri, EkGyanYatra" under the aegis of the honourable Deputy Commissioner of Sibsagar District was flagged off on the 10th of March 2016. The project was envisaged to incorporate all academic institutions under one portal wherein the faculties of institutions of higher learning imparted classes to institutions of lower learning. Faculties from Amguri College from almost all the departments conducted academic exercises in the feeder schools located in the periphery of the college. The mission was adjudged as a grand success



## FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO STUDENTS

Financial assistance is provided to poor and meritorious students. The assistance is provided both by the Govt. (State & Central) and the college authority. In the year 2016-17, 121 no. students were got scholarship from both the Govts, out of which 77 were female. Eight students got UGC Isan Uday Scholarship and nine students got Minority Scholarship.

## COLLEGE PUBLICATIONS

The College has widespread fame in publications and has of publications of repute. Apart from publication of the college magazine annually, the college also publishes hand written magazine by the students, different research journals, seminar proceeding volumes, college news letter women cell magazine etc assigned with ISBN/ISSN.



## GENERAL RULES FOR MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE

- i) The admitted students must abide by the rules and regulations as prescribed by the college authority. Violations may lead to disciplinary actions like compulsory transfer, expulsion etc.
- ii) Students must attend the classes in college uniform.
- iii) Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited inside the college campus. Anybody found indulged in ragging will have to face disciplinary action. Moreover, ragging is considered as an illegal activity.
- iv) Use of Mobile Phones is strictly prohibited in the college campus. Violations may lead to disciplinary action.
- v) The students residing in the college hostel have to follow the rules prescribed by the hostel and the teacher-in-charge appointed therein.
- vi) At the time of admission it is mandatory to submitted the undertaking by the student along with guardian declaration form.

## UNIFORM FOR DEGREE COURSES

For Boys: White shirt, Black formal pant.

For Girls: White Blouse, Muga (or Muga Colored) Mekhela, White Chadar with Navy Blue Border or White Chalwar (general) & Kurta and Navy Blue Dupatta.

## UNIFORM FOR H. S. COURSES

For Boys: Light Yellow shirt and Black formal pant.

For Girls: White Chalwar -Kameez and Light Yellow Sunni.

*In winter session - Black sweater for both boys and girls of all the course.*



## SOME IMPORTANT RULES GOVERNING SEMESTER SYSTEM

These rules apply to those students who are enrolled in the BA/B.Com courses under Dibrugarh University. These courses are of three years duration.

Semester Classification :

Odd Semesters (1st, 3rd & 5th): 1st August - 30th November

Even Semesters (2nd, 4th & 6th): 1st January - 30th June

## ATTENDANCE

i) A student who has less than 80% attendance shall not be permitted to sit for the End-semester examination in the course in which the shortfall exists. Provided that it shall be open to the University to grant exemption to a student who has attended a minimum of 70% classes but failed to obtain the prescribed 80% attendance for valid reasons on recommendation of the Head/Director/ Coordinator of the Department/ Centre on payment of a prescribed fee(s).

ii) The Principal of the college with recommendation of the Heads of the Departments shall announce the names of all students who shall not be eligible to appear in the End-semester examinations in the various courses due to non-fulfilment of the criteria of internal assessment and attendance, and send a copy of the same to the University. In such cases, the student shall have to re-enroll in the relevant course(s) with the next batch.

## EXAMINATION AND EVALUATION

- a) Examination and evaluation shall be done on a continuous basis.
- b) There shall be 20% marks for internal assessment and 80% marks for End-semester examination in each course during every semester.
- c) There shall be no provision for re-evaluation of the answer-scripts of the end-semester examinations. However, a candidate may apply for re-scrutiny.

## INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

- i) In internal assessment, different tools may be employed such as written tests, assignments, paper presentation, laboratory work, students attendance etc. suitable to the courses.
- ii) The students shall be informed in advance about the nature of assessment. Students shall compulsorily attend in the process of internal assessment, failing which they will not be allowed to appear in the End-semester examination. A Student cannot repeat In-semester examinations. However, if a student fails to appear in any of the In-Semester examinations on valid reasons, the department concerned may arrange special in-semester examination whenever necessary.

## END SEMESTER EXAMINATION

- i) There shall be one End semester examination carrying 80% Marks in each course of a Semester covering the entire syllabus prescribed for the course. The End semester examination is normally a written/ laboratory-based examination/Project Work/Dissertation.
- ii) The Controller of Examinations shall then make necessary arrangements for notifying the dates of the end semester examinations and other procedures as per Dibrugarh University Rules (at least 20 days in advance) and the Academic Calendar notified by the University.
- iii) Normally, the end –semester examination for each course shall be of three hour duration.



## BETTERMENT EXAMINATION

- i) A student shall be entitled to take the "betterment examinations" in any two theory courses of any of the six semesters after passing the Sixth Semester examination only once. In this case, the higher marks secured by the student shall be retained. The candidates shall have to apply for betterment examination within one year of passing the Sixth Semester examination.
- ii) No betterment shall be allowed in the practical examinations.
- (iii) Any difficulty which may arise in the course of operation of these regulations relating to holding of examinations shall be removed by the Examination Committee of the Dibrugarh University.

## RESULTS AND PROGRESSION

- (a) A candidate, shall be declared as passed a course, provided he/she secures-
  - (i) At least 30% marks in each course in the end semester examinations.
  - (ii) At least 30% marks in each course in aggregate in the in- and end-semester examinations.
- (b) A candidate shall be declared as passed a semester, provided he/ she passes all the courses of a semester independently.
- (c) The marks of in-semester examinations obtained by the candidate shall be carried over for declaring any result.
- (d) A candidate who fails or does not appear in one or more courses of any end semester examinations up to Sixth Semester shall be provisionally promoted to the next higher semester with the failed course as carry over course(s). Such candidates will be eligible to appear in the carry over course in the next regular examinations of those courses. However, the following restrictions shall be applicable:
  - (i) A candidate shall be entitled to a maximum of three consecutive chances to clear a course.
  - (ii) If a candidate clears the sixth semester examination before clearing all the courses of the previous semesters, the result of the sixth semester examination of that candidate shall be kept withheld and his/ her results shall be announced only after he/ she clears the courses of the previous semesters.
- (e) A student must pass all his/her semester examinations within Five (5) years from the date of admission to the First Semester of any programme.
- (f) Since the Semester system involves continuous assessment, there shall be no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any programme in this system.
- (g) A candidate shall be declared to have passed the Six-Semester Degree B.A./B.Sc./ B.Com programme provided he/she has passed all the Semesters and in all the Courses separately.
- (h) The degrees shall be offered to each candidate, who has passed the Six-Semester Degree B.A./B.Sc./ B.Com programme in the following manner :

General (Non-Major) Programme		Major/ Specialty Programme	
60% and above marks in aggregate	First Division	60% and above marks in major courses in aggregate	First Class
50% and above but less than 60% marks in aggregate	Second Division	50% and above but less than 60% marks in major courses in aggregate	Second Class
40% and above but less than 50% marks in aggregate	Simple pass	30% and above but less than 50% marks in major in aggregate	Simple pass (the same degree shall be treated as general degree for B.A./ B.Sc./B.Com programme)
