## AMGURI COLLEGE: A GLANCE

Established on 17th July, 1967, Amguri College remains the premier institute of higher education, imparting knowledge to the entire locality of Amguri and its nearby area. The college is brought under the deficit system of Grant-in-Aid in 1977 and is affiliated to the Dibrugarh University, Dibrugarh. The college is recognised by University Grants Commission (UGC) in 1998 and has been included in the list of institutions under 2(f) and 12(B) of UGC Act, 1950. The college offers undergraduate degrees in Arts and Commerce under the affiliating university. Besides, it runs Higher Secondary Courses and offers plethora of programmes in distance mode under Dibrugarh University Distance Education Council and Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University (KKHSOU).

The College, enriched with all round co-education activities, has its widespread fame in the entire region and has now turned into a hub of more than 1500 students from all sections of the society.

The College has completed its 50 year journey. Recently NAAC visited Amguri College and awarded Grade with B\* (CGPA 2.55).

## LOCATION OF THE COLLEGE

The college inherits a scenic beauty. It is situated in an area of evergreen hills neighboring to Nagaland and surrounded by reputed tea gardens and tea industries along sides. The college is located at a distance of about one and half Kilometers from Amguri Town. Various transport services are there from the town to the college. ## HIGHER SECONDARY (ARTS)

## HIGHER SECONDARY (COMMERCE)

- English is compulsory for all as a subject.
- MIL(Assamese) or Alternative English as Compulsory subject
- Book Keeping & Accountancy and Business Studies are compulsory for all students Besides, students must offer Economics, and Salesmanship & Advertising as subjects. But, of these two, subject with higher marks will be counted in the final examination.

## DISTANCE EDUCATION PROGRAMME

Apart from the regular courses, the college has affiliated study centres for distance mode education programme under Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University (KKHSOU) and Dibrugarh University Distance Education Council. The various programmes offered in these study centres are BPP, BA, B. Com, BMC, BBA, D.El.Ed, MA (Assamese, Political Science, Economics, Sociology, English, Mass Communication), MSW. Beside, the B. B.Ed course is likely to be started from this academic session. These programmes are intended to meet the needs of ambitious employed persons who are desirous to pursue higher education. These courses are offered at nominal cost. The present number of enrolment in the distance courses has already crossed 500.

## SELF FINANCED COURSE

Amguri college has started the PGDCA Course in the year 2016-17. Since that good numbers of students have admitted in the course and successfully completed their program with University Rank.



## REMEDIAL AND TUTORIAL CLASSES

We have provision for Remedial Classes in English for poor and SC/ST students. Besides, tutorial classes in all subjects are arranged both for H.S. and Degree Level students.

## ADMISSION TO VARIOUS COURSES

- A. Degree Courses (BA/B.Com): Admission to these courses begins as per the instruction of the Dibrugarh University.
- B. H.S. First Year : Admission process begins after the declaration of H.S.L.C. Examination result.
- C. H.S. Second Year : Admission process begins after the declaration of the H.S. First Year examination result. The classes will begin as per the instruction of the Assam Higher Secondary Council (AHSEC).
- D. Admission to these courses is purely on merit basis and is subject to the approval of the Principal/Academic Advisory Committee.

## RESERVATION OF SEATS

Reservation of seats for SC/ST/OBC/PH students is done as per the prevailing government rules. There is also reservation for students having outstanding performance in sports and culture.

## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- i) For admission to a course, the student must apply in the prescribed form enclosed in this prospectus.
- ii) Candidates seeking admission under reserved category must submit attested copies of required certificates from appropriate authority.
- iii) Attested copies of the mark sheet of last qualifying examination along with a copy of the provisional pass certificate from the head of the institution last attended must be submitted.
- iv) Two copies of the present passport size photograph (one copy to be passed in the application form)
- v) Gap Certificate from competent authority is necessary for those students who have passed the qualifying examination earlier than the current academic year.
- vi) The following documents in 'ORIGINAL' must be produced at the time of admission
  - a) Mark-Sheet of the last examination passed
  - b) Provisional pass certificate from the Head of the institution last attended
  - c) Gap Certificate (if required)
  - d) Reserved category certificate (if required)

The completed application form along with necessary documents must be submitted to the college within the specified dates as notified in the college notice board in due course of time. The incomplete application form and the form submitted after the last dates will not be entertained.

## INFRASTRUCTURAL AND CO-CURRICULAR FACILITIES FOR STUDENTS

### HOSTEL FOR GIRLS STUDENTS

The College has an RCC hostel for girls far-off places. The two-storied hostel has a capacity for 100 boarders. Hostel accommodation with all the required amenities such as running water, uninterrupted power supply, sanitation etc. Hostel boarders will provide a subsidy of Rs. 1000/- monthly through DBT as per govt. of Assam norms.



### COLLEGE LIBRARY

Amguri college library is fully computerised and is enriched with more than 20000 text books. Besides, the library has subscribed number of periodicals including magazines, journals and newspapers of regional, national and international repute. The library is equipped with well furnished reading rooms for students and teachers along with other facilities such as reprography, book bank, information circulation board etc. The library has an integrated digital-cum-online interface. The students can borrow books from the library for specified period of time. For the purpose, they are issued with College Library cards. Moreover, book bank facility is available for poor and meritorious students.



## DIGITAL CLASSROOM

Digital Classrooms with modern technology and smart education are available for the students where they can gather maximum knowledge within a very short span of time. The digital classrooms make the entire education environment more interactive, interesting and beneficial.

## HEALTH AND SANITIZATION CARE CENTRE

College Health Care Centre provide and ensure good health practices in college by providing pure drinking water facilities, hygienic canteen services, medical camp for students etc. Proper sanitization of college and wearing mask for all students is also looked after by this centre due to covid-19 crisis along with student's temperature checking by laser LCD digital infrared thermometer. Amguri College follows all the guidelines of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India and Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India to fight against covid-19.

## LANGUAGE LABORATORY

Language laboratory equipped with modern technology and teaching aids is opened up in the college with an endeavour to facilitate the students to learn English in a perfect way through proper pronunciation and spellings.



## SPORTS

Special attention is given to the sports environment of the college. The college has number of sports infrastructures including Basket Ball Court, Outdoor Stadium, Multi-Gymnasium Hall, Indoor Stadium. College Weeks are organised annually in the college premises. Amguri college encourage students to participate in sports activities cross the states.



## STUDENT COMMON ROOM

Common rooms with required amenities like water supply, electricity and sanitation are available separately for both boys and girls.

## AUDITORIUM

An Auditorium with a well-decorated and well-equipped stage and a sitting capacity of more than one thousand participants is available in the college.

## CONFERENCE HALL

The college has an air conditioned, well-equipped and well furnished conference hall with video-conferencing system and a sitting capacity for 70 participants.



## HALLS AND ROOMS

Several spacious Halls and Rooms are available for course classes. These halls and rooms have uninterrupted power supply. The building known as 'Guru-Bhawan' built with MPLAD fund is specially used for Major (Honours) subject classes.

## DRINKING WATER

24 Hours drinking water with cooling facility is available for both the teachers and students.

## SANITATION

Sanitation facility with adequate numbers of urinals and latrines are provided separately for teachers and students. Besides, there is separated provision for boys and girls.

## STUDENTS' UNION OFFICE

Office for students' Union with computer facility is provided in the college for smooth running of various union activities.

## COLLEGE CANTEEN

College canteen is there for both the teachers and students.

## SAFETY MEASURES

For students' safety, person nels have been appointed in the college gate where entry and exit of outsiders are observed and recorded. Moreover, the college has boundary walls and the entire premises are under CCTV surveillance. Fire extinguishers are installed in different corners of the institution.

## HEALTH CARE

Health camps are organized in the college occasionally for various health check-up. These services are provided free to the teachers and students.

## EXTENSION ACTIVITIES

Amguri College performed various extension activities as a part of activities of NSS, NCC, Women study centre, Eco club & Women cell. The Women Cell, Amguri college has adopted a Missing village and do various activities for socio-economics development of the said village.

The pilot project "Maitri, EkGyanYatra" under the aegis of the honourable Deputy Commissioner of Sibsagar District was flagged off on the 10th of March 2016. The project was envisaged to incorporate all academic institutions under one portal wherein the faculties of institutions of higher learning imparted classes to institutions of lower learning. Faculties from Amguri College from almost all the departments conducted academic exercises in the feeder schools located in the periphery of the college. The mission was adjudged as a grand success.



## FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO STUDENTS

## GENERAL RULES FOR MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE

## SOME IMPORTANT RULES GOVERNING SEMESTER SYSTEM

These rules apply to those students who are enrolled in the BA/B.Com courses under Dibrugarh University. These courses are of three years duration.

Semester Classification :

Odd Semesters (1st, 3rd & 5th): As per Dibrugarh University Guidelines

Even Semesters (2nd, 4th & 6th): As per Dibrugarh University Guidelines

## ATTENDANCE

i) A student who has less than 80% attendance shall not be permitted to sit for the End-semester examination in the course in which the shortfall exists. Provided that it shall be open to the University to grant exemption to a student who has attended a minimum of 70% classes but failed to obtain the prescribed 80% attendance for valid reasons on recommendation of the Head/Director/ Coordinator of the Department/ Centre on payment of a prescribed fee(s).

ii) The Principal of the college with recommendation of the Heads of the Departments shall announce the names of all students who shall not be eligible to appear in the End-semester examinations in the various courses due to non-fulfilment of the criteria of internal assessment and attendance, and send a copy of the same to the University. In such cases, the student shall have to re-enroll in the relevant course(s) with the next batch.

## EXAMINATION AND EVALUATION

a) Examination and evaluation shall be done on a continuous basis.

b) There shall be 20% marks for internal assessment and 80% marks for End-semester examination in each course during every semester.

c) There shall be no provision for re-evaluation of the answer-scripts of the end-semester examinations. However, a candidate may apply for re-scrutiny.

## INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

i) In internal assessment, different tools may be employed such as written tests, assignments, paper presentation, laboratory work, students attendance etc. suitable to the courses.

ii) The students shall be informed in advance about the nature of assessment. Students shall compulsorily attend in the process of internal assessment, failing which they will not be allowed to appear in the End-semester examination. A Student cannot repeat In-semester examinations. However, if a student fails to appear in any of the In-Semester examinations on valid reasons, the department concerned may arrange special in-semester examination whenever necessary.

## END SEMESTER EXAMINATION

i) There shall be one End semester examination carrying 80% Marks in each course of a Semester covering the entire syllabus prescribed for the course. The End semester examination is normally a written/ laboratory-based examination/Project Work/Dissertation.

ii) The Controller of Examinations shall then make necessary arrangements for notifying the dates of the end semester examinations and other procedures as per Dibrugarh University Rules (at least 20 days in advance) and the Academic Calendar notified by the University.

iii) Normally, the end –semester examination for each course shall be of three hour duration.



### Grading System

1. The absolute grading system shall be applied in evaluating performance of the students.
2. The following scale of grading system shall be applied to indicate the performances of students in terms of letter grade and grade points as given below:

- \* Exclusive Class Interval technique shall be followed in calculation of Grade Point.
1. The Letter grade 'B+' and above shall be considered as First Class and Letter grade 'B' shall be considered as Second Class.
  2. A student is considered to have completed a course successfully and earned the prescribed credits if he/she secures a letter grade other than F (Failed) or 'Abs' (Absent/ Incomplete).
  3. If a candidate secures 'F' grade in a Course, he/she shall have to reappear in the Course in the next legitimate chance.
  4. If a student secures 'F' grade in Project Work/ Dissertation/ assignment etc., he/she shall have to re-submit it after necessary revisions. The Result shall be declared with next regular batch.
  5. 'Abs' grade shall be awarded to a candidate if he/she has not fulfilled the following requirements:
    - (i) If a candidate fails to appear in any Course(s) in an end semester examination.
    - (ii) If a candidate fails to submit the project work/dissertation / assignment of an end semester examination.
    - (iii) If a candidate is certified as not eligible to appear in any course(s) in an end semester examination by the Course Teacher(s) due to insufficient attendance in lectures, tutorials, practical or field works.
  6. The candidates not appearing in a Semester Examination shall be considered as an 'Abs' candidate and that will be reflected in the Grade Sheet of the candidate. These candidate shall have to convert the 'Abs' grade by appearing in the next examination on the Course (provided he/ she has legitimate chance to appear the Course) concerned or by submitting project work/dissertation/ assignment etc.
  7. Results of the candidates appeared in the Betterment or Backlog Examinations shall not be counted for the award of Prizes/Medals, Rank or Distinction.



## Know the ABC of CBCS under Dibrugarh University

CBCS means Choice Based Credit System. Choice Based Credit System is a flexible system of learning. 'Credit' defines the quantum of contents/syllabus prescribed for a course and determines the number of hours of instruction required.

'Credit' defines the quantum of contents/syllabus prescribed for a course and determines the number of hours of instruction required per week. Thus, normally in each of the course, credits will be assigned on the basis of the number of lectures/ tutorials/ laboratory work and other forms of learning required to complete the course contents in a 14-15 week schedule:

- i) 1 Lecture per week = 1 Hour duration per week = 1 Credit
- ii) 1 Tutorial per week = 1 Hour duration per week = 1 Credit
- iii) 1 Practical per week = 2 Hours duration per week = 1 Credit

### Course Structure

**a) Core Courses:** Compulsory components of an Academic Programme. These Courses are to be compulsorily studied as a core requirement for the programme.

**b) Elective Courses:** Elective courses shall be chosen by each student from a pool of courses. These courses may be intra-departmental, i.e. Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) as well as inter-departmental, i.e., Generic Elective (GE). The students shall have to choose minimum number of DSE and GE in every semester as prescribed in the Course Structure.

There shall be a basket of at least eight Elective Courses having equal number of credits. For the students of the same discipline/ subjects these elective courses shall be intra-disciplinary and shall be called DSE Courses. If the students of other discipline/ subjects (within the Programme) opt these electives shall be considered as inter-disciplinary and shall be called GE courses.

**c) Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):** The Ability Enhancement Courses shall be of two kinds- 'Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses' and 'Skill Enhancement Courses'. These courses shall be inter-disciplinary (within the Programme) in nature. 'AEC' Courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement.

**i. Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC):** (a) Environmental Science (2 Credit), (b) Communicative English (2 Credit) and (c) Alternative English/Communicative Hindi /MIL (2 Credit).

**ii. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):** (minimum 4 credits): The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life-skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability.

d) A Course may also take the form of a Dissertation/ Project work/ Practical training/ Field work/ Seminar, etc.

e) A student shall have to study the academic program as per the scheme of the Program. Even if a candidate earns the required number of credits before completion of the full duration of the program, he/she shall not be entitled for the degree.

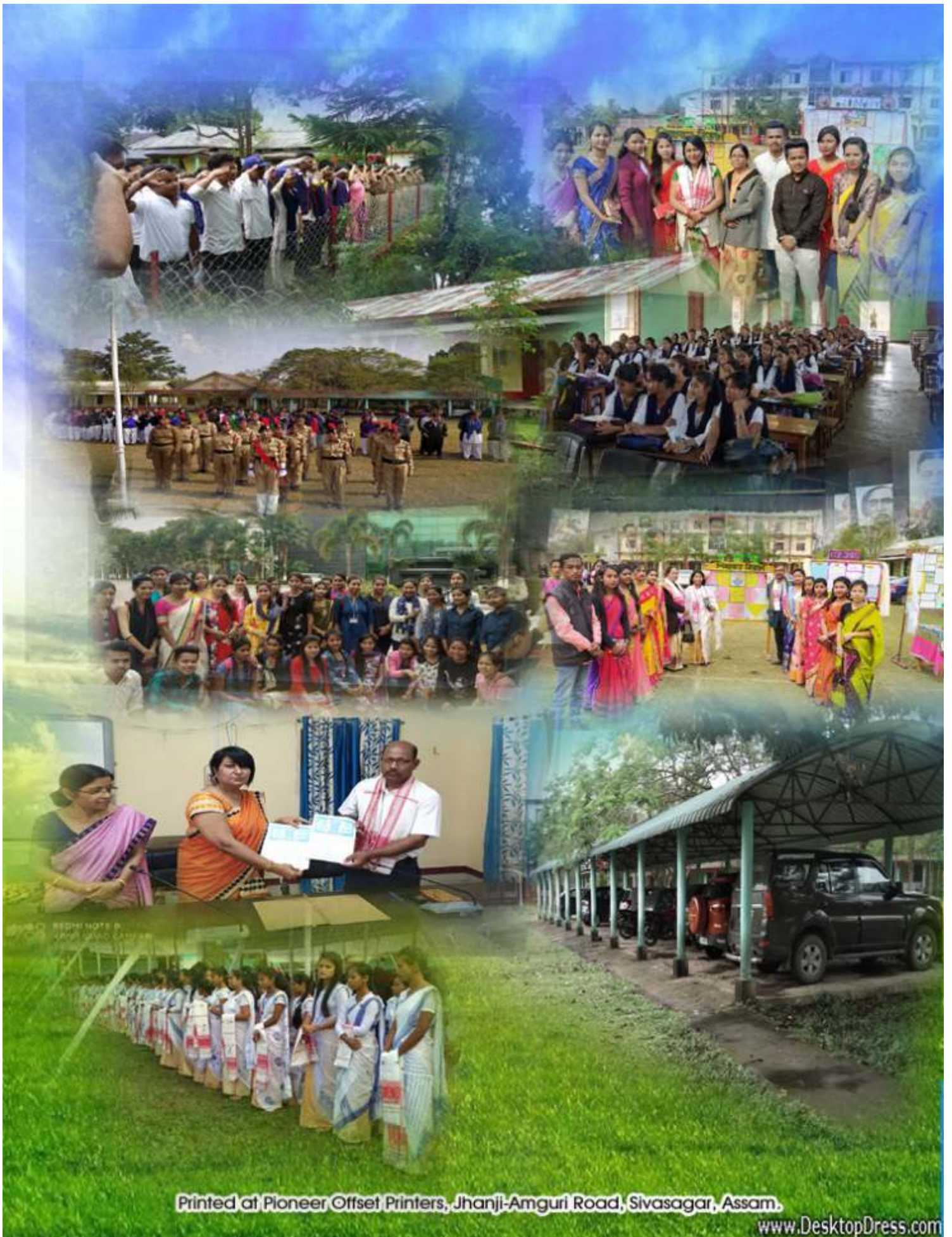
